

Clergy Corner

Dear Members of St. Mary's Parish Family,



I hope you all had a wonderful July 4th celebration. I would like to thank Mary Willet who once again coordinated everything for our Fireworks Booth to raise much needed funds for our Parish. She deserves much gratitude, working as hard as she did in such challenging weather. I also thank all of the

volunteers who helped her, including our SMS school parents and Knights of Columbus.

This weekend's readings present us with profound reflections on God's call and mission in our lives. In the First Reading from the Book of Amos, we hear about the prophet Amos, who is called from his ordinary life as a shepherd to become a prophet for Israel. Despite opposition and challenges, Amos remains faithful to God's call. This passage reminds us that God often calls us from our everyday routines to serve Him in extraordinary ways. Our response, like Amos's, should be one of faithfulness and courage. The Second Reading from the Letter to the Ephesians is a beautiful hymn of praise to God, who has blessed us with every spiritual blessing in Christ. It speaks of our adoption as God's children, our redemption through Christ's blood, and the inheritance we have received. This reading calls us to reflect on the immense love and grace that God has lavished upon us and to live in a manner worthy of our calling as His beloved children. In the Gospel, Jesus sends out the Twelve Apostles, giving them authority over unclean spirits and instructing them to take nothing for their journey except a staff. This passage emphasizes the importance of trusting in God's providence and the mission to spread the Good News.

May this Sunday's liturgy inspire us to embrace our mission with renewed zeal and commitment. On the 16th of this week, we celebrate the feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. It's an important feast for all the Carmelites. I wish you all a happy Feast and ask the intercession of Mary for each one of you.
