

Clergy Corner

Dear Members of St. Mary's Parish Family,



There was once a father named Jairus. a synagogue leader, whose heart was heavy with fear and despair. His beloved twelve-year-old daughter lay at the brink of death. Despite his high status and the expectations of his community, Jairus was not afraid to publicly

seek help from Jesus. He approached Jesus with a heart full of faith, falling at His feet and pleading earnestly for his daughter's life. As Jesus journeyed with Jairus to his home, another story unfolded. In the bustling crowd, there was a woman who had been suffering for twelve long years from a debilitating condition. She had spent all her resources on doctors, but her condition only worsened. With unwavering determination and faith, she believed that merely touching Jesus' cloak would heal her. Her faith was rewarded; she was instantly healed the moment she touched His garment. Jesus, perceiving the power that had gone out from Him, sought the woman who had touched Him. Trembling with fear, she came forward and confessed everything. Jesus gently reassured her, "Daughter, your faith has healed you. Go in peace and be freed from your suffering." Meanwhile, news arrived that Jairus' daughter had died. Overwhelmed with grief, Jairus must have felt his last hope slipping away. Yet, Jesus spoke words that reignited his faith: "Do not be afraid; just have faith." Jesus continued to Jairus' house, where He took the child by the hand and said, "Talitha koum!" (which means "Little girl, I say to you, get up!"). The girl immediately stood up and walked around, much to the amazement of all pre-

These intertwined stories teach us that in moments of deep despair and hopelessness, faith in Jesus can bring profound healing and restoration. Let us renew our faith in the healing and life-giving power of Jesus. Let us not be afraid, but trust in His infinite mercy and love. May we, like Jairus and the woman, approach Jesus with hearts full of faith, believing that He will make all things new.
