

Legacy Book PHOTO SESSIONS





Clergy Corner

Dear Members of St. Mary's Parish Family,



Once upon a time in a small village, there lived an old woman who was known for her beautiful garden. Every morning, she would walk to the river with two large pots, each hanging on the ends of a pole which she carried across her neck. One of the pots had a

crack in it, while the other pot was perfect and always delivered a full portion of water. The cracked pot, however, arrived only half full. This went on daily, with the woman bringing home only one and a half pots of water. The perfect pot was proud of its accomplishments, perfect for which it was made. But the poor cracked pot was ashamed of its imperfection and miserable that it could only do half of what it had been made to do. After two years of what it perceived to be a bitter failure, the cracked pot spoke to the woman one day by the river. "I am ashamed of myself because this crack in my side causes water to leak out all the way back to your house." The old woman smiled, "Did you notice that there are flowers on your side of the path, but not on the other pot's side? That is because I have always known about your flaw, so I planted flower seeds on your side of the path, and every day while we walk back, you water them. For two years, I have been able to pick these beautiful flowers to decorate the table. Without you being just the way you are, there would not be this beauty to grace the house."

This simple story highlights the idea that God can use our imperfections and weaknesses for a greater purpose. Just as the old woman saw the potential in the cracked pot, God sees the potential in each of us, even with our flaws. The readings for the Tenth Sunday of Ordinary Time remind us of the transformative power of God's love and grace. In the Gospel of Mark (3:20-35), Jesus speaks about the importance of doing God's will, which makes us part of His family. Despite our imperfections, when we align our lives with God's will, we become instruments of His love and grace. Like the cracked pot, our lives can bring beauty and blessings to the world in ways we might not even realize.
